Public comment. Chris Ray addressed the Board regarding when Road 165/167 south would be completed. Highway Superintendent Krajewski advised that the work should be finished on Friday May 23, 2025.

No business for the Board of Equalization.

A discussion was held concerning the delinquent taxes for oil, gas, and mineral leases for 2022/2024. Upon receiving information from NACO, the County Attorney Stellar recommended paying the delinquent taxes from the general fund. The wells have been capped and will not generate taxes in upcoming years, and the owner of the leases has not responded. The total amount of the delinquent taxes for these gas and oil leases is less than \$1,200. A motion by Commissioner Klingman, seconded by Commissioner Timm, per the recommendation of the County Attorney, pay the delinquent oil, gas, and mineral lease taxes for 2022/2024 from the general fund. Reichman aye, Timm aye, Klingman aye.

Planning and Zoning Administrator Michele Bartlett, upon her own initiative recommended per State Statute 23-114.01(1) compensation of \$15.00 per meeting for the Planning & Zoning Board members. A motion was made by Commissioner Klingman, seconded by Commissioner Reichman to approve Bartlett's request for \$15.00 per meeting compensation for the Planning & Zoning Board. Planning & zoning no business.

A discussion was held concerning Animal Control for the county. The position is a contracted position for the county. The position will be open June 1, 2025. Efforts will be made to fill the position.

Hwy Superintendent Krajewski reported for the Roads Department. NIRMA conducted the annual shop audits. One of the items noted in the audit was planting corn in the right-of-way at county road intersections; this creates a liability for the county. The Roads department will try to notify landowners concerning this matter. The work on Road 165/167 south will be completed on May 23, 2025.

Sheriff DeCoste presented the April fee report. Total fees collected were \$791.70. Sheriff DeCoste presented a 5-year service plaque to Leslie Snell in appreciation of her dedicated service to the Sheriff's office as Office Administrator.

Sheriff DeCoste advised the Board of two specialized training courses available to the Sheriff's Department. The courses
offer hands-on experience and are hosted in the county. A motion was made by Commission Klingman, seconded by
Commissioner Reichman to approve the training classes for the Sheriff's Department. Reichman, aye, Klingman, aye,
