January 2, 2024

The Deuel County Commissioners met on the above date with the following present: Chairperson Steve Fischer, Commissioner William Klingman, Commissioner Jean Timm, County Attorney Jon Stellar, County Treasurer Alicia Adams, County Assessor Michele Bartlett, Sheriff’s office administrator Leslie Snell, Sheriff Scott DeCoste, Roads Superintendent Kelly Kopetsky, and County Clerk Tammy Sherman. The meeting, notice of which was published in the Chappell Register according to law, was called to order with the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by a moment of silence. Reference was made to open meeting laws, posted at the entrance of the room. The agenda was approved upon motion of Commissioner Klingman, second of Commissioner Timm; Fischer, aye, Klingman, aye, Timm, aye. The minutes of the December 19, 2023, meeting was approved upon motion of Commissioner Fischer, second Commissioner Timm. Fischer, aye, Timm, aye, Klingman, aye.

Public comment, none.

Re-organizational Meeting for January 2, 2024

The Deuel County Commissioners met on the above date with the following officials present: Chairperson Steve Fischer, Commissioner William Klingman, Commissioner Jean Timm, County Attorney Jon Stellar, County Treasurer Alicia Adams, County Assessor Michele Bartlett, Sheriff’s office administrator Leslie Snell, Sheriff Scott DeCoste, Roads Superintendent Kelly Kopetsky, and County Clerk Tammy Sherman. The meeting was called to order at 8:35 a.m.

The first order of business was the election of a chairperson. The County Clerk was instructed to accept a motion for the 2024 Chairperson. It was moved by Commissioner Klingman, second of Commissioner Timm, that Steven Fischer be elected to serve as the 2024 Chairperson of the Board. Fischer, abstain, Timm, aye, Klingman, aye.

Upon motion of Commissioner Fischer, second of Commissioner Klingman, the mileage rate to be reimbursed to Deuel County Employees will be set at \$.67 cents a mile. *(Per Commissioner Minutes March 5, 2001, the rate will be the same as the one recommended by NE Department of Administrative Services; the rate has been set by DAS to .67cents, effective 01/01/24.)

Motion by Commissioner Klingman, seconded by Commissioner Timm to set the 2024 per diem rate for Nebraska reimbursement rates for meals and incidentals, per US General Services Administration at \$13 for breakfast, \$15 for lunch, \$26 for dinner and \$5 for incidentals. Jim and Jane Starostka expressed concerns about the current location of the rifle range located at the Deuel County Fairgrounds. County Attorney Stellar will investigate options to relocate the rifle range, close the site to the public, and the current specs for a public rifle range. Starostka wanted to emphasize that the trap range is fine. A brief discussion was held concerning Wheatland Rd. The Roads Dept. is trying to keep it up as best they can until some kind of better solution can be afforded. With the Highway 30 project to be underway in the area, options may be available for asphalt work on the road.

RESOLUTION 2024-24: WHEREAS, the County of Deuel, a political subdivision of the State of Nebraska, has a comprehensive development plan adopted October 2016 by the Deuel County Board of Commissioners (hereinafter "County Board of Deuel County") pursuant to Nebraska Revised Statute 23-114.02; and WHEREAS, the County of Deuel, Nebraska is in the process of updating the comprehensive development plan; and WHEREAS, the County of Deuel, Nebraska has zoning regulations in place which are intended to direct the location of specific uses and provide for proper separation of conflicting uses; and WHEREAS, the County of Deuel has seen an interest in commercial wind energy systems and commercial solar energy systems, as defined in the current county zoning regulations; and WHEREAS, the County Board of Deuel County wishes to study the existing zoning regulations related to this use; and WHEREAS, the likelihood of commercial wind energy systems and commercial solar energy systems, as defined in the current county zoning regulations, in Deuel County is probable, the County Board desires to review regulations which are appropriate for the county and its residents; and WHEREAS, the Deuel County Planning Commission shall and hereby is directed to review the county zoning regulations and to then make specific recommendations for changes to the county zoning regulations dealing with commercial wind energy systems and commercial solar energy systems, as defined in the current county zoning regulations, before accepting, granting or recommending a conditional use permit for the construction of wind or solar farms; and WHEREAS, the County Board of Deuel County finds that the most appropriate way to work on said regulations is without the possibility of new applications coming forward during a time frame which allows consideration of appropriate commercial wind energy systems and commercial solar energy systems regulations. NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing statement, the County Board of Deuel County, Nebraska, hereby adopts the following resolution: *"BE IT RESOLVED, by the County Board of Deuel County, that a twelve (12) month moratorium on accepting any applications for commercial wind energy systems or commercial solar energy systems, as defined in the current county zoning regulations, is hereby invoked and approved " BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this moratorium will be extended if necessary in order to allow the planning and zoning commission to conduct public meetings, including but not limited to public hearings, in direct regards to current and potential changes to regulations pertaining to commercial wind energy systems and commercial solar energy systems; and to further allow any potential changes to be passed on to the Deuel County*

Board of Commissioners for review, approval, or disapproval with the same previously mentioned considerations as allowed for the Planning and Zoning Commission. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of Deuel County, Nebraska, hereby directs the Deuel County Planning & Zoning Commission to review the county zoning regulations, to conduct any hearings, if necessary, and to make specific recommendations for changes to the county zoning regulations dealing with commercial wind energy systems and commercial solar energy systems, as defined in the current county zoning regulations, before accepting, granting or recommending a conditional use permit for the construction of commercial wind energy systems or commercial solar energy systems and that such recommendation shall be made within twelve (12) months of the signing of this Resolution. "BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the said twelve (12) month moratorium shall become effective as of the date of the approval of this Resolution."
